LIEN & CLEAR TITLE GUIDE

Search the PPSA registry before paying, a lien follows the vehicle, not the debt

WHAT IS A LIEN?

A lien is a registered security interest, typically a loan, against the vehicle. If the seller owes money to a lender and has registered a lien on this vehicle, that lender can repossess the vehicle even after you buy it. The lien does not disappear when ownership changes; it follows the vehicle. You must confirm the vehicle is lien-free OR obtain a lien release from the lender before completing the purchase.

HOW TO READ THE RESULTS

No results found:

The vehicle is clear of registered security interests. This is what you want to see before paying.

Security interest registered:

A lender has a registered claim against the vehicle. Do NOT pay until: (1) the seller pays out the lien in full, (2) you receive a signed lien release letter from the lender, and (3) you confirm the discharge was registered.

Judgment registered:

A court judgment has been registered against the seller or vehicle. Get legal advice before proceeding.

GETTING A LIEN RELEASE

1. Ask the seller to provide the name and contact info for the lender (usually shown in the PPSA search results).
2. The seller contacts the lender, pays out the full outstanding balance, and requests a lien release letter.
3. You or your lawyer confirm the lien discharge has been registered in the PPSA registry before any funds are transferred.
4. Do not hand over any payment until you have independently confirmed the lien is discharged.
5. Consider using a lawyer or notary for this process. They can hold funds in trust until the discharge is confirmed.
